News from the CFSC board meeting

The board and staff of CFSC gathered from $4^{th} - 6^{th}$ March to attend to business, including the management of projects in Canada and overseas. To follow is a bit of news from the weekend.

CFSC representatives going to ecumenical mining conference

KAIROS is hosting an ecumenical conference on mining May $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ in Toronto. The conference will bring together Church leaders from the global South and North; church members who are actively engaged on resource extraction issues; Indigenous and civil society partners from Canada and the global South affected by resource extraction, and church investment staff and/or pension trustees. CFSC is appointing several Friends to participate in the conference *(names being confirmed at press time)*.

Discernment on uranium issues

Canadian Quaker Meetings were sent a document for consideration by CFSC in January to further Friends' discernment on uranium issues. Thanks to the Meetings who have responded so far - **responses from Meetings are requested by April 4**th, so that a document can be finalized for Documents in Advance for Yearly Meeting sessions (to be held in August in Windsor, NS). UN Declaration - KAIROS event in Ottawa – June 20th

CFSC continues its extensive work towards the implementation of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous People in Canada and at international forums. CFSC encourages Friends to engage in KAIROS' "Roll with the Declaration!" action, wherein local communities make banners supporting the Declaration and send them to Ottawa to be unfurled on National Aboriginal Day, June 20th. Carol Dixon, Clerk of Canadian Yearly Meeting, and Jane McKay Wright, CYM's representative on the KAIROS Board, will formally represent Friends in Ottawa.

AGLI Workcamps

CFSC is a partner of the African Great Lakes Initiative of Friends Peace Teams. AGLI accepts workcampers of all ages (and families) - workcampers have been as young as 8, as old as 84. AGLI's goal is for each team to include 6 international (non-African) and 6 local workcampers plus professional builders. Physical & skill requirements: good health and willingness to do manual labour. Construction skills and experience are not necessary.

Members of this organization visited us at the last CFSC Board Meeting and have had ongoing contact with members of Peterborough Allowed Meeting. Peterborough Community Chaplaincy is dedicated to improving community safety by providing a supportive environment for individuals making the transition from prison to the community.

Get creative – or keep it simple – whatever you like. **Send your photos to resisters** Support Campaign will collect all the photos, then assemble them into a montage that we can all circulate through YouTube, Facebook, email, and so on.
