Discrimination Against Indigenous Children

CFSC joined with many partners in issuing a public statement calling on all political parties to end the discriminatory underfunding that is tearing apart First Nations families.

The statement entitled, "Indigenous children's rights denied by indifference and legal technicalities", notes that "the government spends significantly less money per child for children's services in First Nations reserves than its provincial and territorial counterparts provide in predominantly non-Aboriginal communities. More First Nations children are being placed in government care today than were taken away from their families and communities at the height of the residential school era." Restorative justice processes encourage the sharing of stories; stories of trauma, stories of empowerment, stories of deeply felt emotion and community.

Through interviews with people across Canada, and listening to stories and advice from participants, facilitators and other volunteers, authors Lisa Smith and Meredith Egan (CFSC staff) examine community organizing, evolving practices in facilitation, stories of facilitators, and how the public sharing of these stories can be well supported. Muriel Duckworth honoured in portrait exhibit

Muriel Duckworth, acclaimed peace activist and beloved Friend, is being honoured in a portrait exhibit at the Public Archives of Nova Scotia in Halifax, NS. Duckworth is an Order of Canada recipient, was awarded the Pearson Peace Medal and was the first woman from Halifax to run for a seat in the Nova Scotia Legislature. Nine women are being honoured through large-scale portraits in a interdisciplinary art exhibit by Jo Napier. The exhibit, entitled *The Nova Scotia Nine: Great Women of Nova Scotia*, runs June
