

## Marking CO witness in the War of 1812 – June 10<sup>th</sup> event



The Quaker plaque draws attention to our historic commitment to pacifism, our rights of conscientious objection in Canada, and Quaker witness in the war of 1812, which ended in 1814.

Members of the traditional peace churches in the Niagara region are commemorating the experience of Canadian pioneers of peace and conscientious objection in the War of 1812 during the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary year. Historical markers honouring the witness of the peace churches were developed and have been installed at various locations in Niagara (for location information, visit: http://mcco.ca/historical-markers-peace). A full-day public event will be held on Sunday June 10<sup>th</sup> in the Niagara region, including touring all of the markers. #### Get on the Freedom Train!

The Yinka Dene Alliance, a leading group of British Columbia First Nations that has used its laws to ban the proposed Enbridge Northern Gateway pipelines and tankers in their territories, embarked on a "Freedom Train" journey on April 30 aimed at protecting their rights and their freedom from the threat of devastating oil spills. Representatives of numerous First Nations will join the Canada-wide trip that will build on the wide support they have received across the country. The journey began on April 30 and will culminate in Toronto for two days of events, including a concert, rally, march and attendance of First Nations representatives at Enbridge's Annual General Meeting on May 9.

#### Three Young Adult Friends named to attend Youth & Militarism Conference

The Peace and Social Action Committee of Halifax Friends Meeting has selected three Young Adult Friends to attend the War Resister's International Conference "Countering the Militarisation of Youth" in Darmstadt, Germany (June 8-10) – Christel LeBlanc (Halifax Monthly Meeting), Sheehan Moore (New Brunswick MM, currently in Montreal attending McGill), and Matthew Webb (Coldstream MM). The conference provides a unique opportunity to develop an understanding of the reach and consequences of militarization and the possibilities of non-violence in resolving conflicts. Participants will come from around the world, including from Britain, Chile, Germany, Sweden, Netherlands, Israel, Finland, Spain, South Africa, Venezuela, Colombia, USA, and Canada. #### FWCC World Gathering Epistle and statement on peace and eco-justice

The largest worldwide conference of Friends since 1967 came together from 17-25 April 2012 in Kenya. The theme was "Being Salt and Light - Friends living the Kingdom of God in a broken world". One thousand Friends gathered on the campus of Kabarak University, near Nakuru, Kenya, coming from many parts of Asia, Africa, the Middle East, Europe, Latin America and North America.
