CFSC seeks Peace and Sustainable Communities Program Coordinator

Are you interested in promoting a peaceful and sustainable world? CFSC has a staff position available (location: national office, Toronto). The Quaker Peace and Sustainable Communities program committee (QPASCC) Program Coordinator is a 0.6 Full-Time Equivalency (FTE) position (21 hours of work/week). S/he supports the work of the QPASCC program committee, which sets directions for the program, and is involved in program delivery.

Through partnership and led by Quaker testimonies, the QPASCC program committee of CFSC seeks to bring about a world of lasting peace and sustainable communities. Work includes overseas projects in the Great Lakes Region of Africa and projects in Canada focusing on peace and working to create the conditions necessary for peaceful communities (human rights, ecology and economics).

The work of the Program Coordinator includes:

- Program management, including policy-related work, Canada-based and international projects
- Research, education and writing skills
- Administer community-based grants program, workshops and training
- Maintain relationships with partners, meetings, policy makers
- Administrative support to the program
