It might sound like science fiction, but all indications are that research is underway to produce robotic

weapons that are fully autonomous. Canadian Friends Service Committee (Quakers) has signed on to the *Interfaith Declaration in Support of a Ban of Fully Autonomous Weapons*, while noting that we do not support any form of warfare or the development of any type of weapon, whether controlled by humans or operating autonomously. Canadian School of Peacebuilding


Canadian School "Peacebuilding an Institute of Canadian Mennonite University
