Supreme Court of Canada rules unanimously in favour of Tsilhqot'in

CFSC extends our warmest congratulations to the Tsilhqot'in people in their historic victory at the Supreme Court of Canada. In an unanimous decision the Court recognized Tsilhqot'in title and their rights to own, control and enjoy the benefits of their traditional territory in central British Columbia. CFSC is proud to have intervened in this case, which also provides clear directions on the need for consent of Indigenous peoples when there is proposed resource development on their lands.
