#### Joint letter on court challenges

Canada's Court Challenges Program has historically provided funding for challenges under the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms that advance the rights of marginalized and disadvantaged groups.

CFSC applauds the recent reinstatement of the program but has joined in a joint letter raising specific concerns. These concerns include: challenges that are in opposition to the rights of marginalized groups could now be funded; and Aboriginal and Treaty rights (Section 35 of the Constitution Act, 1982) are not included in the list of claims that can be funded. ## Weak oversight of national security

The Bill is seeking to establish a parliamentary oversight committee for Canada's national security agencies. Amendments to give the oversight committee sufficient powers to do its job have been removed from the Bill, effectively proposing an oversight committee with so many limitations that it seems not much better than no oversight. It may in fact be worse than nothing, creating a false sense that true oversight exists.

This is concerning to Friends as we recommended in our submission on national security that greatly strengthened oversight is urgently needed (read out submission at <a href="http://quakerservice.ca/nationalsecurity">http://quakerservice.ca/nationalsecurity</a>). The present government came to power promising increased oversight of national security, and to repeal the "problematic elements" of the Anti-Terrorism Act, 2015 (Bill C-51). To date this has not happened.

#### Healing and Rebuilding Our Communities

For many years, CFSC has been enthusiastic about Quaker peacebuilding work in the Great Lakes region of Africa. This has included supporting multiple Canadians to attend international training sessions in Healing and Rebuilding Our Communities (HROC).

The 10th international training to be an HROC facilitator is being offered in Rwanda from June 25 to July 15, 2017. HROC is a powerful way of bringing together communities that have experienced deep trauma, by beginning to reestablish care and trust.
