A federal legislative framework for the implementation of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples has taken another step forward. Bill C-262, introduced by MP Romeo Saganash, was approved at second reading and has began work at the committee stage. CFSC, with many partners in the Coalition for the Human Rights of Indigenous Peoples, supports C-262 and urge all parliamentarians to support in a non-partisan manner.
