Year-end so far

The end of the year is always exciting for us at CFSC. The Deer Hunt

Each year in St. Catharines, Ontario, the Haudenosaunee hold a whitetail deer hunt in Short Hills Provincial Park. The right to hunt there is guaranteed under Treaty, but each year the entrance to the park is cut off by a group of anti-hunt protesters. In response to this informational workshops have taken place during the hunt to educate anyone interested in knowing more about treaty rights, the Haudenosaunee community, and/or Indigenous-settler relations.

On November 17th, CFSC Program Assistant, Keira Mann spoke on a panel together with members of other churches. The panel was organized by members of the Haudenosaunee and surrounding community. Keira spoke about what Friends have been doing to engage in reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples and how what is happening at Short Hills is part of a larger issue of disrespecting Indigenous Peoples' human rights and treaty rights.

CFSC signs on to peace declaration

Following a gathering held in Toronto and attended by several Friends, including members of CFSC and our Israel/Palestine Working Group, CFSC has signed on to the World BEYOND War

declaration. The brief declaration, signed by groups and individuals from over 160 countries, states:

I understand that wars and militarism make us less safe rather than protect us, that they kill, injure and traumatize adults, children and infants, severely damage the natural environment, erode civil liberties, and drain our economies, siphoning resources from life-affirming activities. I commit to engage in and support nonviolent efforts to end all war and preparations for war and to create a sustainable and just peace.
