## Canada, Stand Up for **Palestinian Children's Rights**



**Canada can help end cruel, inhumane, and  
degrading treatment of children**

CFSC has written again to the government of Canada to express our dismay over the continued military detention and abuse of Palestinian children and Canada's continued silence on the matter. The letter mentions the recent case of Shadi Khouri, a 16 year old student at Ramallah Friends School, a Quaker school, who was "beaten in his home by Israeli military forces, then dragged barefoot, blindfolded, bleeding, and alone, from his home, and placed in detention in the early morning of October 18."
