

After devastating verdict, call on Canada to refuse to extradite Hassan Diab a second time

As readers of the E-News will know, for many years we've been deeply disturbed by the treatment of Hassan Diab. He was previously extradited to France where he spent more than three years in prison, without charge or trial.

He was eventually released came home to Canada in 2018, after the investigative judges found all sorts of problems with the case and the evidence against him

(include evidence that he wasn't in France at the time of the bombing he's accused of). With no new evidence and with all of the problems remaining, a French court tried Hassan in absentia and found him guilty on April 21. Many human rights experts are speaking out about this extreme situation, which is widely seen as a case of scapegoating and anti-Arab racism.




Coalition tells the UN it's time for National Action Plans to implement Indigenous rights

CFSC staff and associate members were at the United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues again this year in New York. We worked alongside Indigenous partners on multiple meetings and this joint statement:

Nearly ten years ago, Member States of the United Nations made a significant commitment by consensus in the Outcome Document of the high-level plenary meeting of the General Assembly known as the World Conference on Indigenous Peoples. States committed, in Paragraph 8 of this Outcome Document, to "cooperating with indigenous peoples, through their own representative institutions, to develop and implement national action plans, strategies or other measures."

The UN Declaration recognizes, in preambular paragraph 8, "the urgent need to respect and promote the inherent rights of indigenous peoples." However, it is nearly ten years after the World Conference, and we have seen very little global progress on National Action Plans. Keep reading.





We joined a large international call for the United Nations to respect human rights while combating antisemitism
