Continued calls for a ceasefire in Gaza

The undersigned organizations are writing to express our deep concern regarding the Canadian government's evolving stance on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict since October 7th. Your government has aligned itself more closely with the Israeli government's position, disregarding the majority of Canadian voices calling for a permanent ceasefire and an end to the conflict. This shift raises serious questions about Canada's commitment to a just and lasting peace in the region.

Canadian civil society, faith based and human rights groups have observed, with great concern, that the current political discourse in Canada has indirectly emboldened institutions – including public agencies, corporations, and educational establishments – to suppress expressions of support for Palestinian rights.
